Mary and the Saints

Question:

Why do Catholics pray to Mary and the saints?

Answer:

One of the statements of faith we make when we pray the Nicene Creed and the Apostles Creed is that we believe in "the communion of saints."

The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us that this communion (another word for community) includes all the faithful on earth, the souls in Purgatory, and the blessed women, men, and children who are in heaven. This teaching is grounded in our belief that, through Baptism, we are united with Christ and to one another with bonds that are stronger even than death.

And so from the time of the early Church, Christians have turned to other believers for prayers and assistance, including those who have gone before us, confident that God hears the prayers of all of His children. While we ask the saints (and one another) for prayers and support, we remember that the saints join us in prayer. But it is God who blesses and sanctifies us.

When we think of Mary and the saints in heaven, we have to remember that we can turn to them for intercession and assistance because they were faulted, limited human beings, just like us. This means that they are able to understand our struggles, doubts, fears, joys, and hopes. But as we learn their stories, we can also begin to recognize that they stand out in the history of the Church because they persevered in their commitment to follow Christ. Whether they were ordained, vowed religious, martyrs, husbands, wives, or even children, they show us that holiness is possible. We can not only follow their example but also benefit from their prayerful support.





Reflections on Readings for the Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

"But Of That Day Or Hour, No One Knows"

On this second to last Sunday in our liturgical year, the Church turns our attention to the Last Thinas - death, judgement, heaven and hell.



Before we begin with our season of Advent, it is good to ponder our mortality and the passing of all things.

In our first reading (Daniel 12:1-3), we hear a very clear description of the resurrection of the dead and everlasting life. Its purpose was to promise final deliverance of God's people who are faithful, while others will meet "everlasting horror and disgrace." This vision offered hope to those who were suffering great persecution - just as it should for us today. "The wise shall shine brightly like the splendor of the firmament." We are also reminded that the Archangel Michael is our protection from evil remember the prayer: "St. Michael, the Archangel, defend us in battle. . . ."

In our Epistle reading (Hebrews 10:11-14, 18), we hear another comparison between the earthly priests of Israel and our eternal high priest, Jesus, who offered one sacrifice for sins and then "he waits until his enemies are made his footstool." Jesus' perfect sacrifice for our sins is offered once; there need be no further offering for sin. It is through the Eucharist and the Mass that we continually participate in the re-presentation of this sacrifice.

In our Gospel reading (Mark 13:24-32), Jesus borrowed from another one of Daniel's visions (Daniel 7:13-14) as He said, "you will see the Son of Man coming in the clouds". Jesus was describing first, the coming destruction of the temple in Jerusalem "in that current generation", which happened in 70 AD, and then His second coming at the final judgement. "But of that day or hour, no one knows....but only the Father."

As we begin to prepare for the close of our liturgical year and look forward to preparations for the awesome and glorious incarnation of Jesus at Christmas, we should keep in mind that God's will unfolds according to His eternal plan. Nothing is happenstance for God. The ultimate triumph of good over evil has been ordained since the beginning of time.

Saints Timothy and Maura Feast Day: May 3

The Church has celebrated the witness of many married couples, and some have been canonized. Saints Timothy and Maura are an example, though they were married for only 20 days.

Timothy was the son of a priest in 3rd century Egypt. He became a lector and protector of Holy Scripture and liturgical books. He also copied the books, preached, and read scripture to the people of his village. He did this all during the persecution of Christians in the era of Emperor Diocletian.

The governor ordered Timothy to surrender all the liturgical books. When Timothy refused, he was subjected to cruel tortures. Maura, his young bride, was brought forth and tortured thinking that Timothy would relent. Neither would deny their faith. Timothy and Maura died together by means of crucifixion in the year 286.

Message from your Parish Health Ministry Team



Medical Orders for Life-Sustaining Treatment (MOLST) is a program designed to improve the quality of care individuals receive at the end of life.

An individual's desires for what care they want to receive are translated into goals of care and preferences for care.

These goals and wishes are translated into medical orders, the MOLST.

The **MOLST** is a medical order form printed on bright pink paper and signed by a physician, nurse practitioner or physician assistant. The form tells others what the individual's wishes are for life-sustaining treatment.

The **MOLST** serves as a document that contains an individual's goals and preferences regarding:

Resuscitation
Instruction for intubation and mechanical ventilation

Artificially administered fluids and nutrition
Antibiotics, dialysis and other treatments

MOLST can be downloaded from the NYS DOH Website: health.ny.gov/professionals/patients/patient rights/molst
